Cllr Marsden reported the following summary of the year:-

Playing Field - This has been a big success, with many thanks expressed to Cllr Trevor Walton. The facility is being used by local residents and outside residents too. Cllr Wells also expressed thanks to Trevor for his hard work.

The Opening Ceremony was a great event and well attended. Singleton-Birch officially opened the play area, it was great weather on the day of the event and enjoyed by all.

Website - The website is working well. It is being used to view events and minutes. It is a 2 way sword.

Airport - The Airport has recently changed hands and Bristow Helicopters Ltd , seem to have large control in the Airport. The Copenhagen service did not last very long, only 5 months. It is now operating from Leeds/Bradford Airport.

There has only been 1 Airport Consultative Committee meeting held in the past year.

Highways - The ongoing battle for speed reduction in Croxton has seen the implementation of the speed limit from 40-30 being introduced. We are moving ahead with the flashing speed reduction signs, once an agreed location has been decided. Singleton-Birch has kindly offered to fund this.

A18 roundabout outside the Airport is still planned.

The C137 Weight Restriction and A18 proposed speed limits battle is ongoing, along with the C137 signage on the North Lincolnshire Council side. The Parish Council has given plenty of feedback to North Lincolnshire Council, without any results.

Remembrance Day - This event has grown and was extremely well attended last year. Many wreaths were laid and the school was involved. This event should continue and grow, along with the 166 Squadron Memorial Day, held in September.

The RAF National Service Association is still continuing their research on the 2 Lancaster's that crashed on the Aerodrome at the end of WWII.

Village Signs - Village signs are still being looked into, along with the possibility of street name signs.

On a sad note the village lost Cllr Roy Whincop this year and Jenny Walton.

Cllr Marsden finished by thanking all Councillor's for their input into the meetings and for the success so far.
